# Proud to be Givitan



We have had a very successful 2015-2016 year and we should be proud of ourselves. Members have worked hard at various projects to raise funds to support our club and various local charities. But, how much have we donated? Well, the figure is almost \$66,000.

CHEO was a big winner with \$10,000 on the Stitch Program. This was the last of the \$30,000 we donated over the past 3 years. We also gave them \$2,250 from our breakfast in June. Almost \$30,000 went to various other charities including GWM Foundation, Heart & Stroke,

Cancer, Friends of the Perth Union Library, etc. We also supported community events like the Halloween Party, Senior's Christmas Party, Music Festival, and other similar events. We spent time at the Perth Fair manning the gates, at the Maple Festival and the Medical Equipment Lending Bank.

When you work at the various events be proud of being a Civitan Member and all the support you give your community.

# LED Project

We changed all our lights in the hall from a mixture of florescent, halogen and incandescent to LED this summer. This project has been a bumpy road from approval to completion. We received our first rebate at the end of October and the other rebate is somewhere in Hydro One's out basket with a projected completion of mid November. Wendy will not be able to determine the actual cost of the project until we receive this rebate.

To determine if the changeover was worthwhile I com-

pared the 2015 and 2016 bills from the month of September. We used 34 kw/h less per day and our bill for hydro usage was \$215.00 less. Some of this may be due to variances in weather, but overall it seems our September hydro usage is 10 to 20 percent less than it was.

We still have 3 Hydro Sentinel Lights at a cost of \$27.75 per month. The power to run these lights is part of our hydro bill and is significant as the lights are either mercury vapour or high pressure sodium. One of our members recently removed one of these lights at home and found the cost of power and rental was about \$50/month.
