## L.E.D. Light Project

Last September the club passed a motion to participate in an Ontario Hydro Retrofit Energy Program where we would completely change our lighting from florescent, incandescent and halogen to the modern LED lights.

After many delays the project is almost complete. All the lights in the hall have been changed to LED, including the florescent lights in the hall. The only ones left to change are the pot lights and two outside fixtures that cannot be retrofitted.

You might notice the hall is slightly brighter now and the lights on the stage come on immediately instead of the startup delay of the compact florescent lights that were there. Gary Munroe of Munroe Electric was kind enough to change the parking lot lights. The only lights in the parking lot we own are the two next to the hall. The ones on the East side of the lot and at the road are owned by Ontario Hydro and rented to us on a monthly basis.

Although we have not had any billing with the new lights the original estimate was the payback was between 2 and 3 years. The lifespan on these lights is also much greater than what we replaced.
