

Message from our Bingo Chair: Civitan Bob Burch

Bingo has been a major fundraiser for our club since Farrell Hall and the Knights of Columbus discontinued their weekly bingo about 1982. The original format was called Bonanza Bingo. There was a prize of \$500 if you had bingo in 50 numbers. Each week it went up one more called number until it was won. I think the consolation prize was about \$200 for a full card if there was no bingo within the weekly number limit. Another game we had was called Super Star Bingo. It was a provincial bingo run by the Ontario Lottery Corporation and each week at 8.30 pm we paused our bingo and tuned into the provincial game. The prizes could be quite large and one of our customers won a car.

The bingo paper has changed over the years as well. We started out with hardboard bingo cards and chips were used to mark the called numbers. We graduated to single strips of bingo paper and programs in protective sheets. The programs were gathered up each week and the dauber marks had to be wiped off the cards.

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About 20 years ago Civitan Peter McTavish provided the idea to go with pads of paper that we currently sell and that has made calculating prizes and sales much easier. Calculating sales by computer-based spreadsheet is a recent innovation. Until about 5 years ago prizes and sales were calculated by counting the unsold bingo paper and subtracting that figure from the number of pads put out for the evening's bingo. There was quite a rush at 7.00 pm to calculate prize levels for the evening.

There was smoking in the hall until the Ontario ban on smoking indoors. We (laughingly) had one row of tables designated as non-smoking. The Perth Lanark Girls Hockey ran a bingo on Mondays and made theirs non-smoking about a year before the general smoking ban. This meant most of our customers were used to the ban before it was implemented by the province.

Civitan members were always split into teams. The number of teams varied between 4 and 6, depending on our membership. The last 20 years we have maintained 5 teams and it seems to work well. We have approximately 90 members and 45 are involved in bingo, either in the canteen or working the floor. Ken Fournier (currently of the Lanark Club) was instrumental in starting bingo at the hall and both he and Glen Moore chaired our bingo at various times.

Each of the local service clubs have one major project that generate significant income. Lions have the Garlic Fest and Rotary the Rib Fest. Civitan has bingo. During the 2017-18 fiscal year Civitan donated \$54,108.86 to various charities and community causes. Bingo generated just over \$32,000 for our charitable donations during the same period as well as \$18,000 towards hall upkeep. That does not include funds raised through Break Open Tickets and Loonie Progressive.

The point of this piece is to let you know bingo is important to maintain the level of donations to our community. We support numerous charitable causes including the Great War Memorial Hospital, CHEO, other hospitals, Perth Union Library, Camp Quality, and others to numerous to mention.

Blood Donor Clinic







“Champions of Service” Brand Messaging and Sub-Brand Guidelines




This “Champions of Service” is a sub-brand of the parent brand of Civitan International. It was created to reach a new audience, who would identify better with a theme associated with the parent brand (the logo Civitan has used for decades). This sub-brand – which has only three words within a laurel wreath - should appear on any supply house items, on collateral pertaining to service of our clubs, and anytime we’re using this specific theme to promote who we are. This sub-brand never replaces the main Civitan logo in formal organizational documents or when first presented on collateral and other items.



This extension of the “Champions of Service” sub-brand develops our message, allowing certain groups to latch on to one of the four words. In the past, International Presidents have introduced a theme for their governors and others to rally around, which in some cases did not reflect the parent brand. This theme changed every year, which can affect brand identity. This developed sub-brand of “Champions of Service: Dreamers, Believers, Leaders and Achievers” allows for that rallying to still happen, but with a more consistent message that reflects the parent brand. This sub-brand can be used for the next four years by the next four Presidents due to the extended messaging. It should be used in cases where

members, staff or others are “spelling out” or developing that whole messaging. World HQ will use it in cases of promoting the organization in one unified way around the “Champions of Service” theme, like this:



Once the International President chooses one of the four identifying words, it can be used among his/her set of governors and other volunteer leaders to spur teamwork and encouragement. For example, for the 2020 Civitan year, the International President and her governors are rallying around the word “Achievers” in the Champions of Service theme. These variations of the sub brand can be used on the shirts they wear as a team, or on items that are specific to this group. The identifying word chosen can also be used in verbiage throughout the year to unify the message and these groups.
